Dear Mr. Tendy:

Enclosed are three copies of the permit to stock triploid grass carp in Roaring Brook Lake, Town of Putnam Valley, Putnam County. Note that the effective dates are March 7 through November 30 of 2011.

During that period, you may purchase up to 500 triploid grass carp for Roaring Brook Lake from any of the suppliers on the attached list. At the time of transaction, the supplier must complete Section B of all three permit copies. The supplier retains one copy for his records, presents you with a copy, and (within 10 days), must send the other copy to me at the address noted on the bottom of the permit.


The triploid grass carp you purchase must be individually certified as triploid. Additionally, live fish shall not be placed into waters of the State unless they are accompanied by a fish health inspection report issued within the previous twelve (12) months. The fish health inspection report for triploid grass carp shall certify that they are free of diseases and pathogens as specified in DEC regulations (per Title 6 New York Codes, Rules and Regulations, Part 188 Fish Health Inspection Requirements). The certificate must show that they are free from:

- (i) Viral Hemorrhagic Septicemia (VHS);
- (ii) Spring Viremia of Carp Virus (Infectious carp dropsy);
- (iii) *Aeromonas salmonicida* (Furunculosis);
- (iv) *Yersinia ruckeri* (Enteric Red Mouth);
- (v) Infectious Pancreatic Necrosis Virus (IPN).

As noted in the Special Conditions portion of your permit, the barrier to fish migration must be installed in the outlet stream of Roaring Brook Lake. You must notify me of the barrier's completion prior to stocking. A barrier of this type will provide assurance that triploid grass carp will not escape into waters in which their presence may be undesirable. A separate permit from myself has been written granting permission to construct this barrier (also enclosed). It is the responsibility of the Town of Putnam Valley to regularly inspect and maintain this barrier as long as triploid grass carp are present in Roaring Brook Lake.

We may contact you and/or visit the pond prior to or subsequent to stocking to assess the effectiveness of control.

In accordance with the conditions listed below, permission is hereby granted pursuant to Sections 11-0507(1) and 11-1703(6) of the New York State Environmental Conservation Law (ECL) to said applicant for the purpose of stocking no more than 500** triploid grass carp into Roaring Brook Lake, Town of Putnam Valley, Putnam County.

PERMIT CONDITIONS:

1. Triploid grass carp shall only be purchased from approved suppliers possessing a DEC permit to import and sell triploid grass carp in New York State.
2. Triploid grass carp shall only be stocked in the water named above and shall not be moved to other waters without a separate permit from the Department.
3. Permittee shall allow Department personnel access to the stocked waters at any reasonable time of the day for collection of physical, chemical and biological data deemed necessary by the Department. Permittee may be required to complete questionnaires pertaining to the fishes effectiveness as plant control agents in the stocked water.

**** SPECIAL CONDITIONS:**

1. Live fish shall not be placed into waters of the State, possessed, transported within or imported into the State for purposes of placing them into waters of the State unless such fish are accompanied by a fish health inspection report issued within the previous twelve (12) months. The fish health inspection report shall certify that the fish are free of: Viral Hemorrhagic Septicemia (VHS), Spring Viremia of Carp Virus (Infectious carp dropsy), *Aeromonas salmonicida* (Furunculosis), *Yersinia ruckeri* (Enteric Red Mouth), and Infectious Pancreatic Necrosis Virus (IPN), as specified in DEC regulations (per Title 6 New York Codes, Rules and Regulations, Part 188 Fish Health Inspection Requirements). Failure to comply with the above conditions is cause for revocation of this permit or license.
2. Up to 500 triploid grass carp, that are greater than 10 inches total length, and have been individually certified as triploid by a New York State Department of Environmental Conservation approved supplier may be stocked in Roaring Brook Lake.
3. The fish barrier, as detailed in the drawing from Princeton Hydro, LLC in the letter dated March 4, 2010 from Mr. Robert Tendy to DEC Environmental Analyst John Petronella, must be installed in the outlet stream of Roaring Brook Lake. Permission has been granted to construct this barrier via permit/letter from Michael Flaherty to Robert Tendy, dated 3/7/2011. This barrier must be monitored and maintained by the Town of Putnam Valley as long as triploid grass carp are present in the Roaring Brook Lake.

Permission is hereby granted pursuant to the provisions of Section 11-0505, Subdivision 1 of the Fish and Wildlife Law to:

Town of Putnam Valley Supervisor, 265 Oscawana Lake Road, Putnam Valley, NY 10579

and his duly designated agents acting on behalf of the Town of Putnam Valley, to install a fish barrier in the outlet stream of Roaring Brook Lake for the purpose of preventing out-migration of stocked triploid grass carp. The fish barrier must be constructed as detailed in the drawing from Princeton Hydro, LLC in the letter dated March 4, 2010 from Mr. Robert Tendy to DEC Environmental Analyst John Petronella. This barrier must also be monitored and maintained by the Town of Putnam Valley as long as triploid grass carp are present in the Roaring Brook Lake.

Permit expires on December 31, 2016 unless sooner revoked by this Department.
